OUR CURRICULUM

Our high-achieving students study a normal secondary school curriculum, in addition to our custom-created curriculum for vocational training in sustainable tourism.

We blended VETA course content for housekeeping, food 8 beverage preparation, front office, and computer studies with our own topics: health and wellness, permaculture, soft skills and sustainability.

INTERNSHIPS

Hands-on experience is a curriculum requirement, and each student must complete an average of 5 weeks' internship per year in order to graduate.

In Aug 2022, 27 students were hosted by 7 different companies. It was our first round of internships in the midst of a busy peak season - and it was a wonderful success.

In Dec 2022, we had more students and more hosts: 37 interns went to 10 companies, and it went beautifully.

We can't thank our industry partners enough: we actually had more places offered than students to fill them this time.



INVALUABLE EXPERIENCE

There is only so much that can be taught in a classroom, and what our students learned in the field is impossible to quantify. One thing they appreciated was learning how to manage situations – and people – when things don't go according to plan... a crucial skill in hospitality!

INSPIRATION

Mentorship from a French-speaking safari guide made one of the girls consider a new career path, and one of our boys is now determined to be a hot air balloon pilot. Another student requested a bigger variety of herbs in the school garden after cooking with new ingredients in camp, and many came back with new recipes to share.

SHARING SKILLS

One of our boys surprised the bar staff by carrying a tray on his fingertips – so he taught them how! On a walking safari, a guest asked about a certain plant; while our student didn't know its scientific name, he shared his knowledge of its traditional medicinal usage – and the guest was delighted.



CHALLENGING ASSUMPTIONS

Staff and guests were often amazed by what our students' skills.

Because of their youth, it was often assumed that they didn't know what they were doing. This was the experience of girls more than boys – but the girls learned how to advocate for themselves and ask for opportunities to prove their capability. They are proud of what they have learned, and they enjoyed proving just how much they can do!

OUR MENTORSHIP PROGRAMME

In January this year we welcomed 40 new students to the school, and each was paired with a mentor.

Each of the new Form 1 students wrote a letter about themselves, and their Form 2 colleagues selected the letters out of a hat - and this is how we paired mentors and mentees!









This way, all that the Form 2 students learned during internship gets passed to the next generation, creating a foundation of knowledge that they will build upon with their own experiences yet to come.
